
-The Global Gender Gap Index evaluate the evolution of gender-based gaps among four key dimensions:


- -156 countries

-The Global Gender Gap Index measures scores on a 0 to 100 scale and scores can be interpreted as the distance to parity (i.e. the percentage of the gender gap that has been closed)

• Economic Participation and Opportunity • Educational Attainment • Health and Survival • Political Empowerment

## **Political Empowerment**

(first-largest of the four key)

Women represent only 26.1% of some 35,500 parliament seats and just 22.6% of over 3,400 ministers worldwide




In 81 countries, there has never been a woman head of state, as of 15th January 2021



# Economic participation and Opportunity

(second-largest of the four key)

Projections for a select number of countries show that gender gaps in labour force participation are wider **since the outbreak of the pandemic.** 



### According to 2020 data from the European Commission, women in the European Union earn 14.1% less per hour than men.

#### WHAT IS THE GENDER PAY GAP?

It is the difference between the average hourly earnings of working men and working women.

Women earn 14.1% less than men per hour in the EU.

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# **Health and Survival**

96% of this gender gap has been closed, registering a marginal decline since last year.

Is the area where gender gaps are smallest on average, and countries' performances are significantly more concentrated





# **Educational Attainment**


In Educational Attainment, 95% of this gender gap has been closed globally, with 37 countries already at parity.



For both education and health, while progress is higher than for economy and politics in the global data, there are important future implications of disruptions due to the pandemic, as well as continued variations in quality across income, geography, race and ethnicity













#### Violence at a glance

#### 1 Femicide

In 2018, over 600 women were murdered by an intimate partner, a family member or a relative in 14 EU Member States, according to official reports. In 2018, the Member States which reported the highest rates of femicide were Malta, Finland and Sweden (murders committed by an intimate partner), and Latvia, Malta and Austria (murders committed by a family member or a relative). #### 2 Physical and/or sexual violence

35 % of women who experienced physical and/or sexual violence, experienced it in their own home. 10 % of lesbian women and 8 % of bisexual women were physically or sexually attacked in the past five years for being LGBTI. Source: FRA's Fundamental Rights Survey and LGBTI Survey II, 2019

#### 3 Harassment

39 % of women experienced harassment in the past five years, and 28 % in the past 12 months. 48 % of women with disabilities experienced harassment in the past five years, and 36 % in the past 12 months. Source: FRA's Fundamental Rights Survey, 2019

#### 4 Cyberviolence

13 % of women were subjected to cyber harassment in the past five years, and 8 % in the past 12 months. Among women aged 16-29, 25 % experienced cyber harassment in the past five years, and 16 % in the past 12 months. s Source: FRA's Fundamental Rights Survey, 2019
